ROUTES INTO LANGUAGES

Speedy Spellers at National Final

On Wednesday, 13th July 2011, 18 pupils from all over the country travelled down to the National Museum Cardiff to compete in the National Final of the Routes into Languages Cymru Spelling Bee Competition 2011.

The competition started back in September 2010 when the first 50 words were published and competitions were taking place in Year 7 languages classes all over the country. In fact, at this stage we had 4300 registered pupils from 43 schools. Throughout the year the competition has progressed with School and Regional competitions taking place and another 50 words were added at each stage. The 18 pupils that reached the National Final had a bank of 200 words to learn and they were competing in one of four categories; French, Spanish, German and Welsh 2nd Language.

The competition was opened by Routes Cymru and CILT Cymru Director, Ceri James who commended the competitors for having reached the final and spoke about how pleased he was to see so many boys taking part. This was followed by words of encouragement from Andy Klom, Head of the European Commission Office in Wales. He expressed his delight of having the opportunity to be a part of this exciting competition, especially when considering the European Union's promotion of multilingualism.

Starting with the Spanish competition, there were two pupils taking part and they well and truly set the standard. Next up was the Welsh 2nd Language competition in which all four competitors whizzed through their words.

French was the largest competition of the event, with eight pupils competing for four

prizes. They all spelled exceptionally well and at the end of the competition we were faced with a tie-break. Megan Jeffery and Tomos Turtle returned to the stage for a suddendeath spell-off! This was not the first time for Megan to have experienced a suddendeath round as she was involved in one that lasted 11 minutes in her Regional heat. Both had obviously been revising hard and knew the word list inside-out. After 15 minutes it was brought to an end when Tomos made a mistake – he was obviously bitterly disappointed but both pupils were brilliant spellers and there could only be one winner.

It was then extremely nerve-wracking for the four pupils in the German competition, but the audience seemed more nervous than they were as they spelled their words in turn and closed the day's competition with an equally high standard.

The prize-giving ceremony was a special part of the day as the prizes were presented by our VIP guests Andy Klom (European Commission), John Evans (European Commission) and Maria José Eguskiza (Conserjeria de Educación). All of the medals and the champion cups were sponsored by the European Commission.

We would like to thank all who were involved in this competition and would also like to wish a huge CONGRATULATIONS to you all on your success.
